This is the second of two sprints to be organised by the Herts County Auto & Aero Club in 2017, our 114th year.

Our course has been developed for this event with a mix of flowing bends, tight turns, fast & slow slaloms, plus a fearsome long straight demanding accurate control. Our club is still investing to resurface much of the course at Debden airfield, which is part of Carver Barracks, home of the 33 Engineer Regiment (Explosive Ordnance Disposal).

The airfield is separated by a security fence from Carver Barracks. We have no access to the Barracks. Everybody attending will need a car pass (provided by the club) and must come in by the marked gateway, as sign-posted on the day. This is a *different* entrance from the main entrance to Carver Barracks.

Overnight camping is permitted, but for access reasons it is necessary to arrive between 14:00 and 17:00 on Saturday. Contact the event secretary for more details.

If you cannot compete, have you thought about marshalling? Marshals are always welcome and, as spectators will not be allowed, marshalling will ensure that you can enjoy a good day's sport. As an incentive, all marshals that sign on will receive a free lunch voucher for use at our posh catering vehicle. Also, our cash prize draw for marshals has extra funds generously donated by our sponsors. No experience is necessary, as we have a competent leader controlling each of our new marshalling posts. SPECIAL NOTICE

The Debden Sprint Circuit nearly lost its licence for Motor Sports last year. Complaints of noise had been made to Uttlesford District Council, caused by other events including Model Jets and SuperCar Days. Despite this we have managed to co-operate with the MOD and the Environmental Health Department of Uttlesford DC for the on-going use of this venue for sprint events. However, we have had to agree with a number of goodwill gestures such as:

- No competitor should attempt to arrive before 07.30 hours.
- Modified cars and Racing cars shall not start or run engines before 09.00 hours.
- Timed practice will not start before 09.00 hours.
- No tyre warming will be permitted.
- A 30-minute lunch break shall be provided.
- The timed runs must be complete by 17.00 hours.

See Section 10 of these supplementary regulations for details of the noise limits. Competitors' co-operation with the above will help us to continue providing you with this much-enjoyed event.

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SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1. Herts County Auto & Aero Club will organise a National (B) Permit Sprint on Sunday, 1st October 2017 at Debden Airfield (MR: 154/TL567344), Wimbish, Saffron Walden, Essex.
2. The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of the MSA Limited (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting code of the FIA), these supplementary regulations, and any other written instructions that the organisers may issue for the event.
3. MSA Permit No: 98408
4. The event is open to all fully elected members of the organising club, registered contenders in the ACSMC, AEMC, AEMC, Sprint championships, Hill Climb & Sprint Assn and members of the following invited clubs: BARC (Midlands), Brighton & Hove MC, Borough 19 MC, Farnborough DMC, Green Belt MC, Harrow CC, Peterborough MC, Tunbridge Wells MC, TR Register, Sevenoaks & District MC, Woolbridge MC, Wickford AC, West Essex MC, Ginetta OC, Austin Healey Club, Morgan Sports CC, RSSOC, 750 MC, VSCC & all Lotus clubs.
5. The event is a round of the following sprint championships:
Essex Extreme Bodyworks AEMC Sprint Championship
Essex Emergency Services AEMC Speed Championship
ACSMC Sprint Championship, BARC Midlands
Borough 19 Speed Championship, Sevenoaks Speed League,
TR Register, SSOC Speed and Lotus Owners.
6. LICENCES:
Competitors must produce a valid 2017 Competition Licence, Club Membership card and if relevant a Championship Registration card. Competitors wishing to collect a signature for upgrading their competition licence must use the Upgrade Card (fully completed, with photograph attached) contained in the Competitors Year Book.

To compete in a Racing or Sports Libre Car, manufactured after 1960 of more than 2000cc (or 1428cc with forced induction), the driver must hold a Speed National A (OPEN) or Race National A licence (H16.1.1), unless the car is currently licensed for use on the public highway and enters the event in a road-legal condition.
7. TIMETABLE for the meeting will be:
07:45 hours, Signing-on & Scrutineering commences
08:45 hours, Drivers Briefing.
09:00 hours, Signing-on closes.
09:00 hours, Practice Runs (two per driver) commence.
After the completion of practice, the **first** timed competition run will start.
After a 30-minute lunch, the **second** and **third** timed competition runs will start.
There may be further timed runs, which will not be scored if any drivers are unable to finish before 17:00 hours.

We wish to acknowledge the help received from T & J Fire Protection in Welwyn Garden City who have supplied and serviced the safety equipment for Debden sprints for many years.

8. CLASSES will be as follows:

Category A: Road-Going Series Production Cars (S10.10.1) and Road Going Specialist Production Cars (S10.10.2) and Standard Cars (S11.9.1) *excluding* cars in Appendix 1

1. 'Standard Cars' (including cars in Appendix 2) up to 1600cc – 2wd only, list 1A tyres only
2. 'Standard Cars' (including cars in Appendix 2) from 1601cc to 2000cc – 2wd only, list 1A tyres only
3. Up to 1600cc – 2wd only, list 1a or 1b tyres
4. 1601cc to 2300cc – 2wd only, list 1a or 1b tyres
5. 2301cc and over – 2wd only, list 1a or 1b tyres
6. 4 wheel drive cars of all capacities, list 1a or 1b tyres

Road-Going Kit Type and Replica Cars (including cars in Appendix 1)

7. Up to 1700cc (excluding motorcycle-engined cars), list 1a or 1b tyres
8. 1701cc and over (including motorcycle-engined cars of any capacity), list 1a or 1b tyres

Category B: Modified Series/Specialist Production Cars (S10.10.3/4) and Modified Specialist Production Cars (S.10.10.4) *excluding* Modifieds with motorcycle engines and *excluding* those listed in Appendix A

9. Up to 1400cc
10. 1401cc to 2000cc
11. 2001cc and over

Category C: Sports Libre Cars (S10.10.6), Modified Cars (S10.10.3 and S10.10.4) that are listed in Appendix 1 and any Modifieds with motorcycle engines

12. Sports Libre Cars up to 1800cc, plus motorcycle-engined cars up to 1100cc, Modified up to 2000cc
13. Sports Libre Cars over 1800cc, motorcycle-engined cars over 1100cc, Modified 2001cc and over

Category D: Racing Cars (S10.10.7)

14. Up to 1100cc
15. 1101cc and over
16. 'Formula Ford' Racing Cars (see appendix 3)

Category E: Marque Classes (Log books may be required to comply with MSA regulations)

18. Ginetta Owners Club
19. Reliant Scimitar & Sabre Owners Club
20. TR Register
21. Lotus

In the event of more than 6 entries, Marque classes may be formed at the Organiser's discretion. These will be listed in the Final Instructions. (n.b. MSA Blue Book section K is not negated by these regulations).

Category F: Allcomers (Any other vehicle. Log books may be required to comply with MSA regulations)

Appendix 1 (Two-seater road-going kit-type and replica cars)

Caterham, Westfield, Sylva, Fisher, Lotus 7, Elise, Exige, 340R, Vauxhall 220, X- Bow and similar derivatives.

Appendix 2 (Standard Cars)

Defined in S11.9.1 and similar (but not exactly the same) to those defined in prior year championship regulations. Standard Car definition applies to those cars made after 01/01/2000. For Class A1 and A2, we have included those cars that meet Standard Car definitions but have been manufactured before 01/01/2000.

Appendix 3

Formula Ford racing cars using Kent, Zetec or Duratec engines. All vehicles must comply with the appropriate Formula Ford technical regulations approved by the MSA for that particular car and year of production.

General restrictions applicable to categories A and E:

Cars must be taxed, insured and MOT tested (where necessary), and road legal in all respects.

Documentation must be produced at signing-on to verify this. Vehicles in category E or F that are not road legal (if allowed by the appropriate marque championship) will require an MSA Log book.

ENGINES: Forced induction will be classified as a capacity increase of **40%** (or 70% for Standard Cars); those using diesel fuel a reduction of **30%** (for example, a 2000cc turbo diesel will be considered to be the equivalent of a 1960cc normally aspirated petrol engine). Turbo **anti-lag** systems are not permitted.

A **rotary** engine will be subject to a **50%** increase in capacity.

In the event of a dispute concerning the compliance of a vehicle to the regulations for the event, the onus will be on the competitor to prove the compliance to the organisers. All vehicles can switch to Category F.

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS: All vehicles must comply with MSA safety regulations as per the 2017 MSA Yearbook section J5.1 to J5.20.13 and sections S10 to S15.2.1 (specific regulations for Sprints & Hill Climbs) and the relevant sections of K as referred to in section S. Vehicles with electrical systems above 50Volts must display a sign beside competition numbers and all batteries require "EC" markings (MSA ref. J5.14.8 & J5.14.9).

9. COMPETITION CAR LOG BOOKS will be required for all Hill climb and Sprint cars unless the car is currently taxed and insured for use on the public highway and competing at the event in a road-going class (S9.1.7).
10. SILENCERS: All vehicles including single seaters must be fitted with silencers at all times and these must reduce the noise produced to below the maximum quoted in the MSA blue book J5.18.1 to J5.18.11. An Environmental Scrutineer will be in attendance and will test all vehicles at two-thirds maximum RPM - this will be carefully monitored. Any car exceeding the noise limits (including random drive-by tests) will be excluded.
11. COMPETITION NUMBERS. These must be shown on both sides of the car. Numbers on cars not transported by trailer MUST be removed before leaving the venue. The organisers will not supply Numbers. Where a car is double entered the numbers not applicable must be completely masked, if this is not done the MSA time keepers may not give a time and in that case a re-run will not be permitted.
12. TIMING: Competitors are reminded that all vehicles must be fitted with a timing strut in accordance with MSA Technical Regulation S10.9. Vehicles shall be fitted with a vertical timing strut mounted so that no other part of the vehicle may cut the beam first, even if the vehicle is not square to the line. This is mandatory.
13. STARTING: Cars will start singly when the preceding competitor has cleared Marshal Point 6 of the course. The starting signal will be a green light. Timing will be automatic and will commence when the light beam is cut. A competitor who makes a premature start or rolls forward into the timing beam will not be entitled to a re-run. The start line marshals cannot be expected to hold any vehicle to prevent its creeping forward.
14. FINISH: Will be indicated by a 'FINISH' board. Timing stops when the finish light beam is cut. Competitors should slow down to 10 mph asap after the finish, and always when travelling in the paddock area.
15. COURSE: The course is approximately 1.3 miles on tarmac. Each driver will have two practice runs and three timed competition runs. If circumstances prevent any drivers completing a third run, the awards will be based upon the first two timed competition runs.

16. **MARKERS:** Times will incur a 5 second penalty for each and every course marker struck during a timed run (or carried forward into a re-run). No time will be awarded to competitors who take the Wrong Route or put Four Wheels Off the indicated course. All course marshals will be Judges Of Fact for penalties.
17. **PRACTICE:** Competitors will have two timed practice runs. No convoy run will be given; competitors are expected to walk the course prior to the drivers briefing. No other practice or tyre warming will be permitted.
18. At the discretion of the organisers a driver can enter more than one car (S9.2.3).
A car may be entered twice by two different drivers (D17.1).
19. **PROTECTIVE CLOTHING:** MSA approved Helmets, Overalls (FIA 1986 & 2000) and Gloves must be worn by drivers while on track. All these items must be inspected and approved at scrutineering (S9.2.1 and K9-K11).
20. **AWARDS** will be presented as follows:

Fastest in each class	First Class Award (<i>Not given in the class that contains FTD</i>)
Second Fastest in each class (min. 5 cars).	Second Class Award
Third Fastest in each class (min. 7 cars).	Third Class Award
Allcomers Finishing Spirit	A Special Award
Best Presented Car (Chosen by Scrutineers)	A Special Award

At the discretion of the organisers, a Special Award will be given to a HCA&AC member for Best Performance and presented at the annual awards evening. All other awards must be collected at the end of the Meeting. Classes may be amalgamated at the discretion of the organisers; the minimum for each class is 3.
21. **RESULTS:** Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after the final run. Protests and appeals should be in accordance with H35, C5 and C6. Final results will be sent by email or post (if selected on the entry form) within 14 days of the event and added to the HCA&AC website www.hertscountyaac.co.uk.
22. **ENTRIES:** The maximum is 120; the minimum is 60. Refunds will be made if the meeting is cancelled. Up to midday Friday 22nd September 2017, if the Event Secretary receives notification that the entrant is withdrawing, the fee will be refunded (less £10 to cover admin. expense).
23. **ENTRY LIST** opens on publication of these regulations and closes at midday Friday 22nd September 2017, or when the maximum entry has been reached, whichever is sooner.
24. **ENTRY FEE** is £80.00 (HCA&AC members £75.00) e-paid to Bank Sort Code 20-29-37 (Account No. 70460753) **or** by cheque made payable to "HCA&AC Ltd." No entry will be valid until payment has been cleared.
